Two-Story Building

Drop-off/ Pick-up

- Infants and Toddlers on same level
 as entry
- 2s and older use stairs/elevator to get to classrooms and for emergency egress

Playground

- Infants/Toddlers have direct access and are same level as playground
- 2s and older use stairs or elevator to access playground

- Newly-built Permanent Center on Homewood Campus
